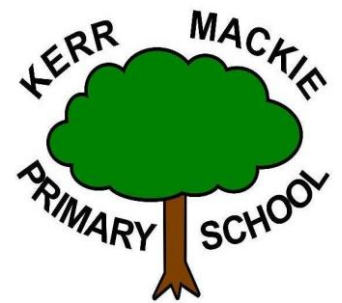


# KERR MACKIE PRIMARY SCHOOL

This is our final newsletter for the academic year 2012-13 and the end of my fourth year as headteacher, a position I am very proud to hold. Kerr Mackie seems such a different school now from when I first arrived and it was fantastic to have this recognized by Ofsted last October.

These are just two examples of the high quality of learning and teaching Ofsted saw. This success is due to the hard work of all the staff and the enthusiastic children.

Other highlights this year include the end of project exhibitions that have been held throughout the year. Starting with our Egyptian, Greek, Fire of London, Viking and Toy Museums and WW2 Tea Dance and continuing with 'The Go-Kart Race', a 'Mini Beast' exhibition, 'Battle of the Bands' and a 'Keeping Healthy' video to name but a few. Your comments in our Visitors' Book demonstrate how impressed you were with the children's learning, enthusiasm and confidence.

The children have been a joy, representing the school in many ways from the fantastic turn out for the Fun Run, with Kerr Mackie achieving 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> places, to all the many sporting events held throughout the year. The children's outstanding behavior has often been commented on, and impressed two ladies who met the Year 5 children in Grassington so much, that they sent us an email!

Our children have achieved well this year, with more children making expected and above progress resulting in a higher percentage achieving level 5 in reading, writing and maths and some children went on to achieve level 6, which is equivalent to working at the level of Year 9 pupils in secondary!

Children, parents, governors and staff have a lot to be proud of and I would like to thank everyone for their continued support and encouragement.

## **SUMMER READING CHALLENGE**

Organised by The Reading agency and the UK public library network since 1999, the Summer Reading Challenge is the UK's biggest annual reading promotion for four to eleven-year olds. The challenge injects creativity, drawing children into their local libraries and inspiring them to read for enjoyment. It combines free access to books with fun social activities and a creative online element.

Throughout the challenge, library staff and teenage volunteers support the children, helping them to discover new authors and explore a wide range of different types of books. Children sign up at their local library and receive a Creepy House poster to get them started. Children read six library books of their choice during the summer, collecting incentives along the way – all FREE! At [www.creepy-house.org.uk](http://www.creepy-house.org.uk) children can follow their progress online, recommend books and gain exclusive access to authors. Children who complete the challenge get a certificate and/or medal. There will be an assembly on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July to promote the challenge. We hope your child will take part.

### **YEAR 1**

### **OUR SCHOOL GARDEN**

"Over the year we have looked after the garden in all seasons. In the autumn we harvested redcurrants, potatoes and some raspberries and we have had all these fruits. In the winter we looked after the birds when it was snowy. In the spring we started sowing seeds – the first things we planted were broad beans and radishes. In the summer we went wildlife hunting. There was a lot of different various bugs such as frogs, worms, beetles and spit bugs. We also planted pumpkins in our garden. In summer we also made 2 scarecrows named Mrs Penelope Pink and Mr Penelope Pink. They were funny but amazing scarecrows."

Each year group has a vegetable plot.

Year 1 are growing: lettuce, peas, sunflowers, courgette, nasturtium and radishes.

Year 2 are growing: strawberries, lettuce, radishes, sunflowers and mint.

Year 3 are growing: herbs, thyme, rosemary, peas, courgette and onion.

Year 4 are growing: mint, coriander, potatoes, gooseberries, nasturtium, radishes and chives.

Year 5 are growing: carrots, raspberries, French beans, nasturtium and borage.

Year 6 are growing: rhubarb, broad beans, peas, pumpkin and Swiss chard.
