To evaluate strengths and areas for development in PE and sport across the school	Areas for development planned for. Staff training to be delivered in autumn term 2017 in teaching REAL PE scheme. This will lead to increased staff confidence. After school provision enhanced to include free football and rugby league clubs. Pupils now have 6 after school sports clubs per week.
PE resources to meet the needs of school	New equipment is being used. The range of balls available mean a wider variety of games can be included in the curriculum and provide differentiated challenge for pupils.
